

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The Housing and Emergency Shelter Trust Fund Act of 2002, known as Proposition 46, was a \$2.1 billion bond passed by California voters in 2002. The bond provides money for a variety of housing programs for California families, including the construction, rehabilitation and preservation of affordable rental and owner-occupied housing, homeless facilities and funding for down payment assistance to low and moderate income first-time homebuyers.

Multifamily Housing

Proposition 46 provided low interest loans for affordable housing development where units are reserved for low income renters, usually for 55 years.

Supportive Housing

Proposition 46 provided low interest loans for housing project that provide health and social services.

Disabled Modifications

Proposition 46 created grants for modification to rental housing to accommodate low income renters with disabilities.

Housing Trust Funds

Proposition 46 provided grants to local governments and nonprofits to fund affordable housing trust funds.

Down Payment Assistance

Proposition 46 provided deferred low interest loans for up to three percent of a home purchase price for low and moderate income first-time homebuyers.

CalHome

Proposition 46 created a variety of homeownership programs for low income households.

Building Equity & Growth in Neighborhoods (BEGIN)

Proposition 46 provided grants to local governments to fund homebuyer assistance in high-density developments.

Self-Help Construction Management

Proposition 46 provided grants to organizations that assist low and moderate income households in building their own homes.

Farm Worker Housing

Proposition 46 provided low interest loans and grants for construction of housing for farm workers.

Migrant Farm Worker Housing

Proposition 46 provided low interest loans and grants for projects that serve migratory workers.

Health-Housing Set Aside

Proposition 46 provided funding for farm worker housing with on-site health services.

Emergency Housing Assistance

Proposition 46 provided grants for the construction of homeless shelters.

Governor's Initiative to End Chronic Homelessness

Proposition 46 funds will be used to build up to 500 new units of permanent housing. Each would house at least one homeless adult with serious mental illness.

Workforce Housing Reward Program

Proposition 46 provided financial incentives to cities and counties that issue building permits for new housing affordable to very low or low income households.

Jobs-Housing Balance Program

Proposition 46 provided grants to local governments based on the amount of housing they approve.
