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CDBG *Economic Development* Fact Sheet

Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG)

The California Department of Housing and Community Development works with California's small cities and rural counties to promote economic development. The Economic Development allocation provides several types of grants to fund private on-site and public off-site infrastructure improvements, provide funding for planning studies, make loans to businesses, and support local training and technical assistance programs. CDBG funding complements other state, federal and private funding sources, and must result in job creation or retention. Please contact your state ED representative for more information.

Planning and Technical Assistance

The CDBG Program provides Planning and Technical Assistance grants to help communities move economic development projects from the idea stage to reality. \$70,000 grants are available annually for communities to conduct planning and technical assistance activities.

Funds Can Be Used For

- Business development feasibility studies
- Business attraction and retention plans
- Infrastructure needs assessments
- Marketing studies
- Technical assistance for specific businesses
- Enterprise Zone application preparation

Over-the-Counter (OTC) Component

Over-the-Counter (OTC) grants can be used to finance publicly owned infrastructure improvements to support businesses where the project will either create or retain jobs. Communities can also loan CDBG dollars to an established business or expand an identified business.

Communities can also take advantage of year-round OTC PTA grants for specific activities such as preparing a pre-application for a CDBG OTC project. These dollars are available for local communities to create the "critical mass" for local development projects to move forward to create jobs in the community.

Funds Can Be Used For

Loans for:

- Land acquisition, building construction
- Equipment purchase
- Inventory, supplies, or materials
- Working capital
- Building renovation/restorations, leasehold improvements

Infrastructure Activities:

- Street improvements
- Water and wastewater systems
- Utilities

Enterprise Fund

Enterprise Fund funds can be used by communities for infrastructure projects, and to develop technical assistance and lending programs to support local small businesses and microenterprises. Small businesses and micro entrepreneurs can access long-term financing at competitive rates to start-up or expand their businesses to create new jobs.

Funds Can Be Used For

Loans for:

- Equipment purchase
- Inventory, supplies, or materials
- Working capital
- Business start-up
- Building renovation/restorations, leasehold improvements

Other Uses:

- Water and wastewater systems
- Street improvements
- Small business and micro entrepreneur training
- Loans to microenterprises
