# California COVID-19 Rent Relief Program Monthly Report to Joint Legislative Budget Committee – July 31, 2021

### **Highlights and Milestones**

As of July 31, 2021, statewide obligations for rent and utility assistance were more than **\$620 million** between the state-administered program and local jurisdictions' use of state block grant funds. Tenants and landlords received more than **\$302 million in rental assistance** from the combined efforts of the state-run program and locally distributed block grant funds from the state's allocation. Details are provided in the section "Geographic Distribution of Funds" beginning on page 6.

During the month of July, the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) made the following changes to the COVID-19 Rent Relief Program pursuant to the enactment of AB 832 (Chapter 27, Statutes of 2021):

- The tenant application was revised to allow for direct assistance to tenants with 100 percent compensation of an eligible household's unpaid rent and utility arrears as well as current/prospective rent.
- The tenant application and payment letter were revised to include the 15-day turnaround for tenants to remit assistance payments to landlords.
- On July 7, 2021, the revised landlord application was deployed. It allows for 100 percent compensation of an eligible household's unpaid rent and also includes the landlord's agreement to release all claims including a claim for unlawful detainer pursuant to Section 1161 of the Code of Civil Procedure.
- Based on the revised payment provisions, HCD's Program Implementer reviewed all previously paid
  applications and processed supplemental payments to increase the aid provided to 100 percent of rental
  arrears and allowable prospective rent.
- HCD's Program Implementer updated its system rules to process all current and new rental assistance applications at 100 percent compensation.
- On July 14, 2021, HCD sent a formal request to all eligible jurisdictions regarding the opportunity to select their administrative option for Emergency Rental Assistance (ERA) Round 2 funds, as well as the opportunity to change their current administrative option for Round 1 funds. Of the 49 localities, 42 responded to confirm their administrative option. Those that did not respond are expected to remain under the same administrative option as in ERA Round 1. The changes and final counts by intended option are as follows, subject to final approval by HCD and the governing bodies of the respective localities:
  - Changed from Option C to Option A 5
  - Changed from Option C to Option B − 6
  - Changed from Option B to Option A − 3
  - Total Option A 20
  - Total Option B 24
  - Total Option C 5
- On July 14, 2021, HCD and the Business, Consumer Services, and Housing Agency hosted an AB 832 training webinar for legislative staff of both houses.
- HCD staff developed policy narratives for handling rental assistance related to subleases, co-tenancy, co-signers, and self-evicted tenants as provided under AB 832.

- During July, HCD staff met with the Judicial Council to develop a process for courts to verify application status via the state's COVID-19 Rent Relief Program call center. This is in response to the provision in AB 832 related to tenant protections that include adjustments to the judicial process through March 31, 2022.
- HCD launched a publicly available online dashboard depicting rent relief statistics for the state program, searchable by county and large city: <a href="https://housing.ca.gov/covid\_rr/dashboard.html">https://housing.ca.gov/covid\_rr/dashboard.html</a>
- The Program Implementer onboarded and trained approximately 150 new case managers and will continue to hire staff members to reach the goal of processing over 8,000 applications per week.

#### **Customer Support**

- During the month of July, approximately 34,609 new tenant and landlord applications were submitted, totaling 129,488 applications submitted since the inception of the program. The number of applications received between June 2021 and July 2021 increased by more than 36 percent month-over-month.
- The Call Center received 152,857 calls, for a total of 479,763 calls since the program inception. HCD increased Call Center staff levels to handle the increased call volume. Although the number of calls handled in July increased by 45 percent over the prior month, callers waited only 94 seconds, on average, for their call to be answered.

#### Outreach

- Continued targeting of ethnic media outlets and morning shows, with pitching and follow-up calls to ethnic, Asian American and Pacific Islander, and Latino media outlets.
- Hosted four media briefings with ethnic press (Asian American and Pacific Islander (two), Latino and African American). Resulted in uptick to website for respective languages and media stories.
- Rent relief press clips for the month of July garnered a reach of 150,058,679.
- Launched Phase III of paid media plan, which included digital and online advertising, including paid search, display, Facebook, Twitter and Instagram; OTT and CTV; general market radio and Spanish, Korean, Chinese, Vietnamese, Tagalog radio and California Black Media network radio; total traffic and weather network radio in English and Spanish; Out-of-Home, including digital billboards, transit shelters, bulletins, eco posters, laundromat and convenience store advertisements; print ads in AA/black, Chinese, Korean, Vietnamese and Tagalog papers, as well as general market publications; Spanish, Chinese, Vietnamese, Korean and Tagalog TV.
- Added 306 organizations to partner list for cumulative total of 4,460 organizations at the end of July receiving rent relief materials and sharing with their networks.
- In an effort to reach possible program participants in remote and disadvantaged areas, HCD explored non-traditional advertisement methods in multiple languages such as posting signage in laundromats, convenience stores, and utility posts.
- The Community Based Local Partner Network (LPN) has grown to 123 confirmed partners statewide serving those areas with highest eviction risk. LPN outreach metrics show a dramatic uptick in activity during the month:
  - 5,237 appointments in July, totaling 15,799 since inception. This represents a 49.5 percent increase since last month.
  - 10,082 inbound Appointment Center Calls in July, totaling 39,224 since inception. This represents a 37 percent increase since last month. The average handle time for calls is approximately 8:47 minutes and assistance is available in 14 languages.
  - 2,682 attendees participated in 106 webinars; over 1,665,000 persons reached through social media and nearly 400,000 persons through newsletter/database reach.

#### **Statutory Basis for Report**

- (1) Pursuant to Section 50897.4 of the Health and Safety Code, the department shall submit to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee, on a monthly basis for the duration of the program, a report that provides programmatic performance metrics for funds administered pursuant to this chapter. The report shall include, at minimum, the following information:
- (A) Obligation of funds for assistance provided under this chapter.
  - In total, \$620 million obligated to rent and utility assistance statewide.
  - \$294.4 million obligated for jurisdictions in the State-Administered Program (Option A) and \$119.6 million obligated for the State-Administered portion of Dual Implementation jurisdictions (Option C) as of 7/31/2021.
  - **\$206.7 million** in State Block Grant funds obligated by locally administered programs (Option B) as of 7/31/2021.
- (B) Expenditure of funds for assistance provided under this chapter.
  - In total, \$302 million expended for rent and utility assistance statewide.
  - \$155.8 million expended on behalf of jurisdictions in the State-Administered Program (Option A) and \$55.4 million expended on behalf of the State-Administered portion of Dual Implementation jurisdictions (Option C) as of 7/31/2021.
  - \$90.8 million in State Block Grant funds expended by locally administered programs (Option B) as of 7/31/2021.
- (C) Expenditure by eligible uses for assistance provided pursuant to this chapter.
  - All expenditures were applied to eligible uses as listed in the tables provided on the following pages of this report.
- (D) Reallocation of funds, if any, for assistance provided pursuant to this chapter.
  - No funds were reallocated as of 7/31/2021.
