More homeowners impacted by 2017 and 2018 disasters are moving back into their newly reconstructed homes with the help of ReCoverCA. In one case, a Butte County man's home was completed in less than ten weeks from groundbreaking to occupancy. "[ReCoverCA] did an outstanding job building my house," the man said. "I have a happy future thanks to my new home." In addition to stick-built homes, dozens of mobile homes are expected to be installed in the near future.
