This NTP sets forth specific details concerning the individual project proposed by Subrecipient for the Stand-Alone Disaster Recovery Infrastructure Project located at the project address listed below and related approved activities by Subrecipient, as required. This Project is subject to, and hereby incorporates by this reference, the terms of the Agreement and is subject to the overall program funding allocation amount for Subrecipient as determined by the Department and set forth in the Agreement. There may be other Projects either already existing under the Agreement, or that may be proposed in the future. The budget for this Project, when added together with the total cumulative budget of all existing Approved Projects for Subrecipient, may not exceed the total funding allocation for Subrecipient.

- C. Any proposed revision to the Project Work must be submitted in writing for review and approval by the Department and may require an amendment to this NTP. Any approval shall not be presumed unless such approval is made by the Department in writing in its sole and absolute discretion.
- D. Subrecipient shall withhold as retention 10% of all DR-Infrastructure funded Contractor payments. No retention payments shall be released to the Contractor or reimbursed to the Subrecipient until receipt and approval by the Department of all required Approved Project completion documents identified in Exhibit B, Section 6 of the Agreement.

3. Performance Milestones and Project Schedule, and Expenditure Deadline

The Agreement is effective on the date shown in the STD213 form. Subrecipient shall meet all milestones identified in the Agreement, particularly those identified in Exhibit A and B and as provided below. Failure to meet performance milestones can result in the Department taking action to withhold future payments from any project and requiring a mitigation plan, as outlined in Exhibit A Section 6.B of the Agreement.

- A. Expenditure Deadline:
 - The Expenditure Deadline for Activity funds is December 1, 2025. With the exception of the grant closeout procedures set forth in Exhibit B, Section 6, the Subrecipient shall complete all Approved Project activities on or before the Expenditure Deadline. Project closeout activities are due on the contract expiration date.

- 5) Subrecipient must expend 50% of the Subrecipient Allocation at least 12 months prior to the agreement expiration date as set forth in Section 2 of the STD 213.
- Subrecipient must submit project applications for their entire allocation amount of DR-Infrastructure funds by the application deadline. If Subrecipient fails to do so, the Department reserves the right to deobligate, recapture, and/or reallocate the Subrecipient's allocation amount in this Agreement by the amount not applied for.
- 7) There are no additional milestones.

C. Project Schedule:

See Attachment 2 for the project schedule. The Department understands that the project schedule tasks and dates will be adjusted outward from the effective date of the NTP. Notwithstanding such adjustments of the schedule, in no event shall performance milestones mentioned above be similarly extended, delayed, or postponed. Subrecipient shall provide the Department updates on the status of meeting the project schedule at minimum of a quarterly basis, or more frequently as specified by the Department (i.e. monthly). Subrecipient will provide this update in Activity Report submitted through Grants Network.

4. Reporting Requirements

Scope of Work:

The Project consists of the construction of a new bridge to connect the existing roadway sections of Notre Dame Boulevard over Little Chico Creek. The new structure will accommodate two 12-foot travel lanes separated by a 6-foot-wide center median, eight-foot bike lanes, a five-foot sidewalk on the west side and an eight-foot multi-use path on the east side. The new bridge is anticipated to be a multi-span structure, approximately 100 feet long and 56 feet wide. The structure type is expected to be a three-span, cast-in-place, reinforced concrete bridge with 30-degree skew, a 2.0% Cambered 20" thick concrete deck, and will include rock slope protection at the banks under and adjacent to the bridge. In addition to the bridge, the existing bike path on the south side of the creek will be re-routed to a new bridge undercrossing and connect to the multi-use path crossing the bridge. Construction of the bridge will involve excavation for and construction of concrete abutments and piers, founded on either spread footings or deep foundation. Other temporary work within Little Chico Creek includes falsework erection and removal, and installation of scour countermeasures at the support locations. Little Chico Creek is a seasonal creek and construction is anticipated to proceed without the need for a temporary water diversion system. Construction of the roadway approaches will involve the removal and realignment of a portion of the existing bike path on the south bank. The approach roadway will tie into the existing curb, gutter, and sidewalk on the north and south portions of Notre Dame Boulevard. Approach roadway work will include both median and parkway landscape per city standards as well as street lighting and public utility extensions crossing the creek.

Project Description:

The proposed project area is located between two disjunct sections of Notre Dame Boulevard in Chico, specifically Block Group 4, Census tract 9.03. While Chico was not in the 2018 Camp Fire burn scar, the magnitude and regional geography of Butte County resulted in Chico being the center of recovery efforts, location of displaced residents, and regional hub of our area. This project area census tract has a diverse population of residents including families with children attending the nearby schools, elderly, low-income residents, and displaced disaster residents. This project is needed to provide connection to the existing roadway sections of Notre Dame Boulevard over Little Chico Creek. Construction of a bridge and multi-use path, as well as re-routing of the existing bike path, will provide residents and visitors using all modes of transportation access to affordable housing, schools, restaurants, recreational spaces, and State Route 32 (SR 32).

Data taken from the Healthy Places Index indicates this tract has healthier economic conditions than only 31.7% of other California tracts, denoting a need for improved infrastructure and amenities. As of 2021, there were four affordable housing sites in existence in this census tract, with two sites pending, and vacant parcels available for potential future sites (City of Chico). Existing and potential future affordable housing sites help to support housing recovery post disaster. Additionally, there are various low-income housing apartments located in this area, including Community Housing Improvement Program (CHIP) apartments. Two schools, Little Chico Creek and Marsh Junior High School, are in this census tract, both of which serve students from the larger southeast section of Chico. Over fifty percent of each school's students utilize free or reduced-price meals (California Department of Education). Construction of a bridge and multi-use path will allow students to safely travel to and from school using alternative modes of transportation. Likewise, the bridge will serve as a secondary point of egress in case of a disaster.

As a result of the Camp Fire disaster, the City of Chico population dramatically increased by approximately 18,000 people between 2018 and 2020 (CA Department of Finance). The population increases can be directly attributed to relocation of fire survivors from the Town of Paradise and surrounding areas. These notable population increases have significantly impacted congestion within the City of Chico and have increased the need for housing, improved infrastructure, and additional points of egress.

This project will directly serve displaced residents from the Town of Paradise within LMI scenarios in the southeast part of Chico and will connect affordable housing units to the adjacent schools (Little Chico Creek Elementary School and Marsh Junior High School).
