What is the purpose of CDBG-DR programs?

- Focus on long-term recovery efforts.
- Addresses unmet needs that other federal programs have not addressed yet.
- Funds SUPPLEMENT and fill remaining gaps.
- CDBG-DR cannot supplant other federal funds.
- Laws and Regulation: Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act, 24 CFR Part 570, 2 CFR Part 200



What is the goal of the Workforce Development Program?

 Funding from this NOFA supports economic revitalization in the five eligible disaster impacted areas with job training across all trades for complete community recovery from the 2018 wildfire impacts.



Available funding

- Total amount \$40,694,942
- Regional allocations

Application Threshold Criteria

Subrecipient Programs funded through this NOFA must:

- Provide workforce training and services within one of the eligible impacted counties
- Meet a national objective to assist Low- and Moderate-Income (LMI) persons
- Be either a new or existing program, where CDBG-DR funds will not supplant existing local or state funds
- "Tie-back" to the 2018 wildfire disasters
- Eligible applicant type
- Eligible activity





Disaster Recovery Workforce Development (DR-Workforce) funds help local governments and nonprofits in affected areas develop their workforces' skills to help their economies develop and recover after disasters.

Program Overview

The Disaster Recovery Workforce Development (DR-Workforce) Program supports local jurisdictions and workforce training programs to deliver job training alongside a wide range of supportive and career services. These activities are intended to address economic revitalization as a part of disaster recovery in identified areas. In collaboration with local governments, community colleges, training providers, and partner state agencies, DR-Workforce funds will help create or expand programs that address the unmet need for skilled labor and specialized training.
